Jesus's Promise

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God."

Matthew 5:9 (NIV, 2011)

1. What are we doing?

"For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit...." Romans 14:17 (NIV, 2011)

2. Why are we doing it?

"...[B]ecause anyone who serves Christ in this way is pleasing to God and receives human approval." Romans 14:18 (NIV, 2011)

3. How do we do it?

"Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification." Romans 14:19 (NIV, 2011)

- 4. Read Roman 14:18. How will our desire to serve Christ change the way that we respond to conflict? How does this response please both God and others?
- 5. Read Roman 4:19. What sorts of things can we do that will lead "to peace and to mutual edification"?
- 6. What truth from this study will you think about and try to apply throughout the coming week?
