Discussion Questions:

- 1. Describe a time when someone has encouraged you. What effect did that encouragement have upon you?
- 2. Read Ephesians 4:1-6. Why does Paul emphasize everything that we who follow Christ share in common?
- 3. Read Ephesians 4:7-9 and Psalm 68:18. In the Psalm, the King receives gifts, but Paul interprets the passage to mean that the King gives gifts. What do these two sides of this truth tell us about the King that we serve?
- 4. Read Ephesians 4:10-13. Paul starts by mentioning the leadership gifts that put things in motion. How do all of us continue the work that this leadership initiates?
- 5. What truth from this study will you think about and try to apply throughout the coming week?
