"On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he asked, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' 'What is written in the Law?' he replied. 'How do you read it?' He answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" 1. Why does it seem like people in our culture are so quick to take sides and so slow to compromise?
2. Read Luke 10:25-29. What is the lawyer’s primary concern? What is he unsure about?
3. Why does the lawyer ask Jesus to define “neighbor” for him?
4. Read Luke 10:30-32. What do you think may have been going through the priest and Levite’s mind as they walked by the man bleeding on the side of the road? How would they be able to justify this action for themselves?
5. Read Luke 10:33-35. What is significant about the fact that the one who helped the wounded man was a “Samaritan”?
6. Read Luke 10:36-37. Jesus turns the question around. Instead of asking, “Who is my neighbor,” we should be asking “Am I a good neighbor?” What does it take to be a good neighbor?
7. Who in this story is closer to inheriting eternal life?
8. What truth from this study will you think about and try to apply throughout the coming week?
